TONIGHT'S GAME: Teams **USA** and **Dominican Republic** tonight are meeting in the **World Baseball Classic** for only the second time, including a **3-1 DR win** here at **Marlins Park** in the **2013 event**...**USA** is **4-5 vs DR** since **1999**, when professional players first were allowed to play in international competition.

WELCOME BACK: **Marlins Park**, beautiful home of the National League East Division's **Miami Marlins**, is serving as a **World Baseball Classic** host site for the third time...the venue hosted **Round 2** games in both **2009** and **2013**...**Team USA** is **4-4** in its **8 WBC games** here, including last night's dramatic 10-inning, 3-2 victory vs **Colombia**.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to the first round, **RHP Jake Odorizzi** (TB) replaced **RHP Sonny Gray** (Oak) in the inactive designated pitcher pool (DPP)...**IF/OF Josh Harrison** (Pit) replaced **IF Matt Carpenter** (StL)...**RHP Danny Duffy** (KC), who had been on the active roster as part of the DPP, replaced **C A.J. Ellis** (Mia) on the permanent roster...**LHP Drew Smyly** (Sea), who originally was an inactive designated pitcher, took **Duffy's** spot as one of the roster's active designated pitchers...last night, **RHP Mark Melancon** (Wsh) and **RHP Jeff Samardzija** (SF) were added to the inactive DPP, and **RHP Michael Fulmer** (Det) was removed from the inactive designated pitcher pool.

POOL E NEWS: **Israel** (3-0) and **Kingdom of the Netherlands** (2-1) of the **Seoul bracket** will meet **Japan** (3-0) and **Cuba** (2-1) of the **Tokyo bracket**...play at **Tokyo Dome** begins at 10:00 p.m. tonight, when **Israel** hosts **Cuba**...**Netherlands** hosts **Japan** tomorrow morning at 7:00 a.m. ET.

POOL C NEWS: **Pool C** began here earlier today with **Canada** (0-1) hosting **Colombia** (0-1) and continues tonight with **Dominican Republic** (1-0) hosting **USA**...tomorrow's doubleheader has **Colombia** hosting **Dominican Republic** at 12:30 p.m. ET and **USA** hosting **Canada** at 7:00.

POOL D NEWS: Today's doubleheader includes **Italy** (1-0) hosting **Venezuela** (0-1) at 3:00 p.m. ET and **Mexico** (0-1) hosting **Puerto Rico** (1-0) at 9:30...tomorrow's DH includes **Puerto Rico** hosting **Italy** (2:30et) and **Venezuela** hosting **Mexico** (9:00et).

DESIGNATED PITCHER POOL: Depending on the construction of the roster, each team can have up to **10 designated pool pitchers**, including up to **2 on the active roster**...up to 2 designated pitchers can be removed after each round and replaced by 2 pitchers from the designated pool...USA designated pool pitchers **RHP Tanner Roark** (Wsh) and **LHP Drew Smyly** (Sea) are active in the first round...the remaining designated pitcher pool includes **LHP Brett Cecil** (StL), **RHP Michael Fulmer** (Det), **LHP J.A. Happ** (Tor), **RHP Jake Odorizzi** (TB) and **RHP Alex Wilson** (Det)...**RHP Sonny Gray** (Oak) originally was on the list of inactive designated pitchers but was replaced by **Odorizzi**...**Smyly** originally was an inactive designated pitcher but was added to the active roster when **RHP Danny Duffy** replaced **C A.J. Ellis** on the roster's active list.

PITCH COUNTS: Pitchers are limited to **65 pitches** per game in Round 1, **80 pitches** per game in Round 2 and **95 pitches** per game in the Championship Round...pitchers are allowed to exceed the limits to finish a batter...pitchers who throw more than 50 pitches in any game cannot pitch again until a minimum of 4 days have passed...pitchers who throw more than 30 pitches in any game cannot pitch again until a minimum of 1 day has passed...pitchers cannot pitch 3 consecutive days.

DETERMINING WINNING PITCHER: Official Baseball Rules **9.17(a)(1)** and **9.17(b)** shall not apply to WBC tournament games...per **Rule 9.17(e)**, in a non-championship game "the official scorer shall credit as the winning pitcher that pitcher whose team assumes a lead while such pitcher is in the game, or during the inning on offense in which such pitcher is removed from the game, and does not relinquish such lead, unless such pitcher is knocked out after the winning team has attained a commanding lead and the official scorer concludes that a subsequent pitcher is entitled to credit as the winning pitcher."

THE MANAGER: Team USA is led by **Jim Leyland**, who served as a Major League manager for **22 seasons** for the **Pirates** (1986-1996), **Marlins** (1997-1998), **Rockies** (1999) and **Tigers** (2006-2013)...ranks 15th on the all-time list among MLB managers with **1,769 wins**...was named **NL Manager of the Year** in **1990** and **1992** and the **Manager of the Year** in **2006**...led the **Marlins** to a **World Series** championship in **1997** and the **Tigers** to **American League pennants** in **2006** and **2012**...he was preceded as Team USA's **World Baseball Classic** manager by **Buck Martinez** (2006), **Davey Johnson** (2009) and **Joe Torre** (2013), who as MLB's **Chief Baseball Officer** currently is serving as the team's **general manager**.

12 NOLAN ARENADO, 3B **Colorado Rockies**
 Is a 2-time National League All-Star with 4 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards at 3B and 2 Louisville Silver Slugger Awards...in each of the last 2 seasons led the NL in both HR and RBI...is the first player since Mike Schmidt (1980, 1981) to lead the NL in HR and RBI in consecutive seasons...over the last 2 seasons led all Major League players with 263 RBI and ranked third with 83 HR (Nelson Cruz 87, Chris Davis 85)...in 2016 joined Ichiro Suzuki as the only players ever to win Gold Gloves in each of his first 4 Major League seasons...is of Cuban (father) and Puerto Rican (mother) descent...after the 2016 season, he and his family visited Cuba for the first time.

2 ALEX BREGMAN, INF **Houston Astros**
 Is playing on his fifth USA Baseball squad (see Page 4)...was the first high school player to win USA Baseball's Player of the Year Award...at 22 years old is the youngest player on the team...in 2016 became the first player in the Astros' organization to win USA Today's Minor League Player of the Year Award...also was named Astros Minor League Player of the Year, ESPN.com Prospect of the Year, MLB Pipeline Hitter of the Year and a *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star...participated in the 2016 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game in San Diego and fell a homer shy of winning that event's Home Run Derby...in June 2015 became only the second player ever drafted by the Astros with the second overall pick (RHP J.R. Richard, 1969)...last season made his Major League debut with 49 apps for the Astros...in his last 41 games hit .308 with 8 HR, 32 RBI and an OPS of .917 and in that span led the team in hitting and RBI while ranking second in HR, slugging percentage, runs scored and doubles.

 The 2015 National League All-Star is a 2-time World Series champion...has won 2 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards and a Louisville Silver Slugger Award...in 2015 became the first Giants player to win a Gold Glove and Silver Slugger in the same season since Barry Bonds in 1997...in 2015 and 2016 became the first Giants player to win consecutive Gold Gloves at any position since Omar Vizquel in 2005 and 2006...his 168 RBI the last 2 seasons are the most by a Major League shortstop.

44 PAUL GOLDSCHMIDT, 1B **Arizona Diamondbacks**
 Is a 4-time National League All-Star with 2 Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Awards and 2 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards at 1B...finished second in the BBWAA's NL Most Valuable Award voting in both 2013 and 2015...since 1998 is 1 of only 5 players to finish in the Top 2 twice in a 3-year span (Ryan Braun, Albert Pujols, Ryan Howard, Barry Bonds)...is the first Diamondbacks player elected to start more than 1 All-Star Game (2014, 2015) and the first D-Backs hitter named to more than 1 *The Sporting News* All-Star Team (2013, 2015)...ranks among his franchise's all-time leaders in RBI (2nd, 507), walks (2nd, 391), extra-base hits (2nd, 349), doubles (T2nd, 198), hits (3rd, 844), stolen bases (3rd, 99) and HR (3rd, 140)...in 2016, joined Jeff Bagwell (1997) as the only first basemen in Major League history to record at least 20 HR and 30 stolen bases in a season...his 34 steals last year were the most by a first basemen since Gregg Jefferies in 1993 (46).

5 JOSH HARRISON, INF/OF **Pittsburgh Pirates**
 In the ninth inning of Thu's 7-5 exhibition loss to the Red Sox hit a 2-run HR off Taylor Grover...on 3/4 was added to the roster to replace Cardinals injured IF Matt Carpenter...in 2014 was a National League All-Star, ranked second in the NL in hitting (Justin Morneau, 1st) and finished ninth in the BBWAA's Most Valuable Player Award voting...last season established career highs in RBI (59) and stolen bases (19)...in his career has played 2B (227g, 189gs), 3B (215g, 170gs), SS (37g, 22gs), LF (38g, 28gs) and RF (65g, 46gs).

35 ERIC HOSMER, 1B **Kansas City Royals**
 Is participating in his second World Baseball Classic...in the 2013 WBC hit .200 in 6 apps (5-25, 1 2b, 5rbi, 1bb, 6k, 1sb, 1e)...also played for USA's 2010 Professional National Team...has won 3 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards...was MVP of the 2016 All-Star Game in San Diego...twice was voted by the KC chapter of the BBWAA the Les Milgram Royals Player of the Year Award (2013, 2016)...is a 2-time nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award (2014, 2016)...his 29 career Postseason RBI are the most in franchise history, passing Cooperstown Hall of Famer George Brett (23) during the 2015 World Series...in 16 apps during that 2015 Postseason set a club record with 17 RBI, just 4 shy of David Freese's 2011 Major League Postseason record...his 197 RBI the last 2 seasons rank ninth in the American League...over the last 4 seasons, he ranks ninth in the AL in hits (663) and multi-hit games (190).

10 ADAM JONES, OF **Baltimore Orioles**
 In last night's 10-inning, 3-2 win vs Columbia produced 2 of the team's 6 hits and both RBI, including the game-ending single off Guillermo Moscoso...is a 5-time American League All-Star with 4 Rawlings Gold Glove Awards and a Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...is participating in his second World Baseball Classic...in the 2013 WBC hit .162 in 6 apps (4-22, 1 2b, 4rbi, 2bb, 6k, 2sb)...since he joined the Orioles in 2008 leads American League outfielders in hits (1,448) and games played (1,321) while ranking second in RBI (730) and third in HR (222)...ranks among the Orioles' all-time

leaders in HR (6th, 222), RBI (7th, 730), hits (9th, 1,448) and doubles (10th, 242)... is the only Orioles outfielder to produce at least 25 homers in 6 consecutive seasons (2011-2016)...is the all-time leader in RBI at Oriole Park (396).

3 IAN KINSLER, 2B **Detroit Tigers**
 Twice in his career produced 30 homers and 30 stolen bases in a season (2009, 2011)... in 2016, the 4-time American League All-Star won his first Rawlings Gold Glove Award... his 28 homers tied Lou Whitaker (1989) for the most in a season by a Tigers second baseman...produced a club record 8 leadoff homers...when he hit the 200th homer of his career on 7/3/16 at TB became only the 40th player in Major League history to produce at least 200 HR, 1,000 runs scored, 1,600 hits and 200 stolen bases...became the seventh-fastest player to reach those numbers (Willie Mays, Bobby Bonds, Barry Bonds, Alex Rodriguez, Larry Walker, Carlos Beltran)...spent the first 8 seasons of his career with the Rangers before he was traded to the Tigers on 11/20/13 in exchange for 1B Prince Fielder and cash.

 The 2-time All-Star is participating in his second World Baseball Classic...in the 2013 WBC hit .400 in 3 apps (2-5, 1rbi, 1bb)...in 2016 for the Brewers and Rangers established a career high with 24 homers, recorded the most caught stealings by any catcher since 2009 (40) and led all Major League catchers in RBI, total bases and slugging... while playing for the Brewers in 2014 became the first player in modern Major League history to lead his league in doubles (53) while appearing primarily at catcher...over the last 6 seasons, among all big league catchers ranks second in total bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

22 ANDREW McCUTCHEEN, OF **Pittsburgh Pirates**
 Also played on USA's 2004 18U National Team...the 2009 National League Rookie of the Year and 2013 Most Valuable Player is a 5-time All-Star with 4 Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Awards, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award and a Roberto Clemente Award... his 175 career homers rank fifth in Pirates history behind Willie Stargell (475), Ralph Kiner (301), Roberto Clemente (240) and Barry Bonds (176)...joins Bonds as the only Pirates to produce in a career at least 150 HR and 150 stolen bases...in 2015 became only the second Pirate and eighth player in Major League history to produce at least 150 HR and 150 stolen bases in his first 7 seasons (Willie Mays, Bobby Bonds, Darryl Strawberry, Eric Davis, Barry Bonds, Alfonso Soriano, Matt Kemp)...in 2017 is expected to be the Pirates' right fielder after making each of his 1,175 career apps on defense in center field...in the last 7 seasons beginning in 2010, his 1,063 starts in CF are the most in the Major Leagues and his 1,174 hits from that position tie Adam Jones for the most...made his only professional appearance in right field on August 22, 2006 with Class AA Altoona.

31 DANIEL MURPHY, 2B **Washington Nationals**
 Is a 2-time All-Star and has 1 Silver Slugger Award...one of the top free agent signings of the 2015 offseason, finished second to Chi's Kris Bryant in the BBWAA's 2016 National League Most Valuable Player voting after leading the NL in slugging (.595), OPS (.985) and doubles (47) while finishing second in hitting (.347)...had a career-high 25 homers and tied single-season franchise records (2005-2016) for hits (184) and doubles...joined Hall of Famer Rogers Hornsby as the only second basemen ever to hit at least .347 with 25 HR, 104 RBI and a .595 SLG in a single season...in each of the last 5 seasons recorded at least 37 doubles, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues...no other players has more than 3 straight seasons of at least 37 doubles...since 2012 leads all Major League players with 200 doubles...over the last 3 seasons ranks seventh in the majors in most plate apps per strikeout (9.73)...in 19 career Postseason apps has hit .351 (7hr, 17rbi), and his 26 hits the last 2 playoffs tie for the third-most by any batter.

 Also played on USA's 2004 18U National Team...the 2010 National League Rookie of the Year and 2012 Most Valuable Player is a 4-time All-Star with 3 Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Awards, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award and 3 World Series championships...is 1 of only 14 players to win NL Rookie of the Year and MVP awards...in 2012 became the first player since Frank Robinson (1966) to win a league MVP Award, batting title and World Series in the same season...his 53 career apps and 23 RBI in the Postseason are the most in Giants history...is 1 of 17 catchers to have caught at least 3 no-hitters.

Never Surrender

The **U.S. Department of Defense** explains the appearance of the **American flag** facing "backward" on the right uniform sleeve of the Team USA uniform...according to **Army Regulation 670-1**, under *Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia*, when authorized for application the **American flag patch** is to be worn, right or left shoulder, so that the star field faces forward...when worn in this manner, the flag appears to be flying in the breeze as the wearer moves forward...the appropriate replica for the right shoulder sleeve is identified as the "reverse side flag"...soldiers say it means "never surrender."
